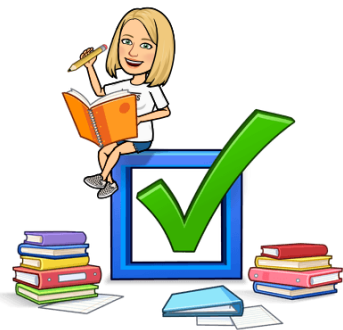
\*Always have your daily required supplies with you.

### Assignments

**Students should read all assigned readings to be prepared for class discussions and regularly review and study vocabulary and INBs to be prepared for assessments.**

*Most work will be able to be completed in class if students use their time wisely. The exception to this would be any weekly homework or long term projects. Some work may need to be done outside of classes to research or finish final touches.*

### Literature Units

**Students should read all assigned readings to be prepared for class discussions and regularly review and study vocabulary and Readers Notebook to be prepared for assessments.**

*Our weekly lessons will focus on guided, group, individual practice and discussions of standards and novels. A test and project will finish each novel study, along with various quizzes and mini-assessments each quarter.*

- Detention

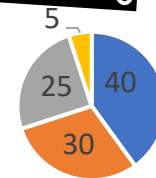
#### Extra Credit
